No student is guaranteed admittance or continuance in the design technology major. Sudents may decide at any time to return to the general theatre major.

Continuance: Students must pass a screening portfolio review and interview administered by the faculty every spring. Additionally students must maintain a Caverage and abide by the theatre student handbook regulations for the design technology major.

Requirements for graduation include a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.00 overall and in the major, a grade of Cor better in all courses required for the major, including prerequisite courses, 120 credit hours, which must include both a minimum of 30 credit hours overall and 12 credit hours in upper-level courses in the major program from Old Dominion University, completion of ENGL 211C or 221C or 231C, and a writing intensive (W) course in the major with a grade of Cor better, and completion of Senior Assessment.

This four-year plan is a suggested curriculum to complete this degree program in four years. It is just one of several plans that will work and is presented only as broad guidance to students.
